The meeting took place in the large meeting room located in the Municipal Building, Minotola.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman John Brunini.

Dennis Yoder of Remington, Vernick & Walberg provided the BBMUA with a copy of the completed and submitted NJDEP TWA permit application for the elimination of the UV disinfection

Robert Smith of Remington, Vernick & Walberg forwarded information to Kim Curtin of Solis Partners, Inc. in regard to the proposed solar project for the BBMUA and Buena Regional School District and Atlantic City Electric. Mr. Curtin reviewed the information and responded to Robert Smith. Mr. Curtin does not see a problem with the BBMUA or the Buena Regional School District obtaining authorization from Atlantic City Electric. The necessary letters have been sent to Atlantic City Electric and we are awaiting a response.

The EMEX energy auction was held on Wednesday, June 4, 2014. The lowest bid came in at \$0.10 per kWh. Upon analyzing the information EMEX decided that the price to compare on this auction was not beat. EMEX will continue to watch the market and advise the BBMUA on when they think it is best to hold another auction to try to obtain a better rate for electricity.

A letter was received from Joseph Joyce of Solis Partners, Inc. informing us that Kim Curtin has left Solis Partners and he will be the new contact for the proposed solar project. Secretary/Treasurer, Cheryl Santore called Mr. Curtin to speak with him in

regard to this letter. Mr. Curtin advised Ms. Santore that he indeed is still the representative that will be working on the project. He is no longer an employee but a consultant of Solis Partners, Inc. and will continue to be our point of contact. Mr. Joyce sent a letter clarifying the situation and apologized for any confusion that he caused.

A letter was received from Gary Centifonti, the program supervisor for the State of New Jersey Department of Health Consumer, Environmental, & Occupational Health Services regarding a new online system for submitting the annual Right To Know Survey. Currently Jeffrey Noone handles all of the Right To Know information. Mr. Zorzi asked if the board wanted Mr. Noone to continue. The board agreed that Mr. Noone should continue to handle this and to have Mr. Zorzi register him with the new system so the annual survey can be filed.

Mr. James Harris, the plant operator that was hired to replace Robert Guglielmo, has approached his 90 day trial period. It is the board's understanding that Mr. Zorzi is pleased with his work and agrees that he will be made a permanent full time employee.

This week a problem with the sewer line at the Buena Camping Park has arisen. The line had to be jetted a few times and it still did not fix the problem. Mr. Rooter was contacted to video the line. When video was taken it showed that there were huge fist size balls of grease in the line. The only restaurants on that line are Villa Fazzolari's and The Great Wall Chinese Restaurant. Mr. Zorzi went to check with Fazzolari's. All records show that the grease trap at Fazzolari's is cleaned and the grease is taken away on a regular basis. He then went to the Chinese restaurant and they stated that they do not pour the grease down the drain. They stated they have a barrel in the back and put all of their grease in the barrel. Mr. Zorzi checked the line coming out of the pumping station that services the Chinese restaurant and it was full of grease. Mr. Zorzi informed Chairman Brunini and was instructed to contact Michael Testa Jr. and provide Mr. Testa with the necessary information regarding the incident. Mr. Testa will send a letter to the owner of the Chinese restaurant and inform him that he has 14 days to clean the line or the line will be shut-off until the line is repaired properly with a grease trap.
